### STATE DEPUTY MESSAGE



It has been a very gratifying year as I wrap up my time as State Deputy. This year we implemented a number of changes including updating the State Lottery, ushering in a considerably revamped State Convention programme as well as continuing to develop our social media platforms and increase our K of C brand awareness in our communities. As well, we had our best recruiting intake in 17 years this Fraternal Year, recruiting 67 new members. As well, we made significant inroads in Faith in Action Supreme Sponsored programs

like Coats for Kids and Aid and Support after Pregnancy (ASAP) as more Councils agreed to the support these FIA programs. This year at our Annual Convention we "passed the Hat" and collected \$2215.00 for the Island Pregnancy Center (IPC) for which I had the pleasure of presenting the Executive Director IPC with that amount on behalf of all Island Knights.

Perhaps our most significant accomplishment this year was the stand up of Cor and its implementation by half of our Councils. Cor is an evangelizing tool designed to strengthen Men's faith and lead them to discipleship through regular fellowship gatherings that focus on prayer, formation and fraternity. It is the necessary ingredient in leading our Councils and our membership as well as men in our parishes and those who are "far away" to become evangelized and evangelizing in helping our Parishes to become missionary in outlook and outreach!

In looking back, these three years as State Deputy were a whirlwind of activity. Given the severe demographic imbalance of our membership and councils, our focus has been and remains on revitalizing our Order here on PEI and ensuring that those Councils which are in danger of becoming non-operational - don't, through recruitment and using a variety of methods designed to encourage men to join the Knights of Columbus, This process has required a significant change in how we conduct activities and recruitment as well as increasing our brand recognition in our communities. I am extremely thankful that we had the right people in the right positions at the right time to drive these changes. To that I owe a big thank you to the State Executive Officers, our Faith in Action Directors, our Lottery Chair, our Convention Planning Chair and Team, Special Olympics Chair as well as our EFF Director, all of whom oversaw and implemented these changes over the past three years. I am also thankful for the many Grand Knights and Councils which have responded positively to these changes, I am also thankful to our Bishop, His Excellency Bishop Joseph Dabrowski, our State Chaplain Fr Andrew Handrahan and our Diocesan Priests for their spiritual guidance and support to their Councils and our Order here on PEI, and our many Lay Brothers and Sisters who daily assist us in our endeavorsas. I also wish to thank our wives many of whom also toil along side us in our Parishes helping to bring others to the Lord. Finally, I extend best wishes to our new State Deputy Savio Dias and the new State Executive Officers, District Deputies and Program Directors who will be working on behalf of all PEI Knights of Columbus members and our Parishes in Fraternal Year 2024/2025.

#### STATE CHAPLAIN'S MESSAGE TO THE KNIGHTS

#### **Reverend Andrew Handrahan**



"But someone will say, "You have faith and I have works." Show me your faith apart from your works, and I will show you my faith by my works."

James 2:18 - ESV

As a part of our Catholic Faith, we know of the intimate connection between faith and works. We are aware that true and authentic faith will always express itself concretely in the lives of the faithful. Our faith is something this is always to be put into action and lived out. In faith we conform ourselves to Christ, who is love; and seeking to be like Christ we ourselves

strive to love, to act in charity. The Catechism teaches us:

"Faith is the theological virtue by which we believe in God and believe all that he has said and revealed to us, and that Holy Church proposes for our belief, because he is truth itself. By faith "man freely commits his entire self to God." For this reason the believer seeks to know and do God's will. "The righteous shall live by faith. "Living faith" work(s) through charity." The gift of faith remains in one who has not sinned against it. But "faith apart from works is dead": when it is deprived of hope and love, faith does not fully unite the believer to Christ and does not make him a living member of his Body." (CCC 1814-1815)

And so it is that our order has long been a great champion of charity. The Knights of Columbus is a group that works in charity at local, national, and international levels. It has been a champion of charity for a hundred and forty-two years, from its beginning when it sought to alleviate the genuine suffering of Catholic men and families in a fiercely anti-Catholic society. And now, in our time, we have a renewed focus. At the State Chaplain meeting in New Haven at the beginning of June, the Supreme Officers have committed to their intent that the Knights of Columbus will be, 'first in faith, as we are in charity'. We have seen this renewal already taking place in the rolling out of the COR initiative, as we seek to find ways for the men of our councils, and all the men of our parishes, to grow in the faith that they have received, and to find fraternity in the work of that growth. This is so important for us, because faith is at the center of what we do and who we are:

"The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently bear witness to it, and spread it: "All however must be prepared to confess Christ before men and to follow him along the way of the Cross, amidst the persecutions which the Church never lacks." Service of and witness to the faith are necessary for salvation: "So everyone who acknowledges me before men, I also will acknowledge before my Father who is in heaven; but whoever denies me before men, I also will deny before my Father who is in heaven." (CCC 1814-1816).

We are to keep, profess, bear witness to, and spread the faith. Our new initiatives within the order are meant to assist men in this. They are meant to help us all to be strengthened in our faith, in order that we might be better equipped in this modern world to do just this. Let us open ourselves with hope, that we might become 'first in faith as we are in charity'.

# St. Mary's Holy Family Council Kensington



Seven Cor men's groups began on PEI over the past year. Nearly 100 men are gathering regularly in Tignish, Wellington, Summerside, Cornwall and Charlottetown to pray, learn the faith, and spend time in fellowship. Several groups studied the Holy Father's encyclical Patris Corde – With a Father's Heart, a meditation on the life of St. Joseph. Other Cor groups followed the Knights of Columbus Into the Breach videos (Series 1 and 2). Each Cor groups mees at the time that fits each group's schedules - for example Saturday mornings, Sunday and weekday evenings, or even weekday afternoons.

Cor is Latin for heart and comes from St. John Henry Newman's motto 'Cor ad Loquitur' (Heart speaks to Heart). 
